Attention Child Care Providers

Kindergarten Age Has Changed! Starting August 2014,

A child must be 5 on or before July 31 to enter kindergarten.

Commonly Asked Questions:

- 1. When does the age change take effect?
 - Starting August 2014, for DOE school year 2014–2015, a child must be 5 years old on or before
 July 31 to be eligible to attend DOE kindergarten. DOE will not accept a child who is not 5 on or
 before July 31.
- 2. What are some options for children who do not make the cut-off date for kindergarten?
 - o Families may consider various settings, such as group child care centers, family-child interaction learning programs, and/or registered family child care for their children.
- 3. Will state funding be available to help families pay for their children who are no longer eligible for kindergarten?
 - A limited number of subsidies, based on several criteria including family income and family size, will be awarded through the Preschool Open Doors program within the Hawaii Department of Human Services (DHS). Through Preschool Open Doors, eligible families select the preschool of their choice, which may include any group child care center or group child care home licensed by DHS.
 - The Child Care Connection Hawaii program, also within DHS, provides assistance to families who are employed, in school, or in a job training program and require child care to maintain their employment, schooling, or job training, and meet income eligibility requirements for their family size.
 - o In both programs, subsidies go directly to the families. Both programs use a sliding fee scale for eligible families: the subsidy amount varies based on the family's gross monthly income, family size, and type and cost of care. Child care providers may also access earlylearning.hawaii.gov for resources that are being developed by the Executive Office on Early Learning for child care providers.

Please be aware that your families may have the following questions or concerns:

- o Will you have space (i.e., capacity) to keep my child for another year?
- What do I need to do to reserve a space for my child next year?
- o Are there any financial assistance programs my family can access?
- o How will your program for 5-year-olds be different from your program for 4-year-olds?
