Pūnana Leo classrooms are warm, nurturing places that value and stimulate young minds and prepare them for lifelong learning. Our approach to education is through a family-based model. Parents participate in *hui kīpaepae* weekly language and culture classes held at the school site, *lā 'ohana* family days, and *ho'iho'i honua* giving back to their school by cleaning the classrooms and school grounds.
