PRESCHOOL OPEN DOORS – SUBSIDY

The Preschool Open Doors (POD) program is a separate subsidy program with limited funds that provides services state-wide to families sending their children to a licensed preschool during the school year prior to kindergarten entry. The goal of POD is to promote school readiness for children, and the program focuses on meeting the needs of the child. Parents are not required to have an eligible activity, unlike the CCCH Subsidy program, but they must meet income and other eligibility requirements. HAWAI'I STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH — EARLY INTERVENTION SECTION (EIS)

Services are provided to infants and toddlers below three years of age who have a developmental delay or are at biological risk (diagnosis or condition with a high probability of resulting in developmental delay) and their families. A child is evaluated to determine eligibility for services.
