Lt. Governor Sylvia Luke's Ready Keiki meeting on June 27, 2024.

- Attended via Zoom and observed, as this was my first meeting.
- Important points of information include:
 - New Ready Keiki classrooms opening this school year. EOEL now taking online applications as well as paper.
 - Increase in funding to Preschool Open Doors (POD) and opening application period up has resulted in increase in applications.
 - School Facilities Authority (SFA) new staff, Executive Director Ricky Fujitani and Policy & Program officer Cheri Nakamura.
 - Ongoing challenge of not enough qualified staff for DHS licensed programs. Programs have closed classrooms due to lack of staff.
 - Other initiatives were mentioned. Link to LT. Gov.'s site is on EOEL website.
